Focus of the Study: Improving Lung Cancer Screening

Kentucky's lung cancer burden is the highest in the country. Most lung cancers are diagnosed at a late stage. Now lung cancer screening can find it early when it is more treatable and beatable. Many people don't know about lung cancer screening, if it is right for them, or how to find a quality lung cancer screening program. The goal of this project was to enhance the quality of lung cancer screening in hospitals across the state.



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What We Did:

10 lung cancer screening programs shared information on how they conduct screenings. We gave them resources to improve the quality. When the quality is better, the patients receive better care. We also created a scoring system known as Quality In Lung Cancer Screening Score (QUILSTM).

What We Learned:

All lung cancer screening programs delivered high-quality radiology services to eligible individuals. Common challenges were: (1) getting patients back for screening and (2) getting them help to quit tobacco. All programs increased the number of people getting screened and the QUILSTM score improved, showing better quality. Those that had a dedicated navigator helping patients through the process did the best.
