Midwife means "With Woman"


- Midwives have been caring for women in childbirth since the beginning of time (Exodus 1:15-20, Shiphrah and Puah)
- By 1900, physicians were attending about half of the births in the U.S.
- Nurse-midwives are educated in the two disciplines of nursing and midwifery
- Nurse-midwives provide care to women across the lifespan



Mary Breckinridge's Vision

"In France midwives were not nurses. In America nurses were not midwives. In England trained women were both nurses and midwives. After I had met British nurse-midwives, first in France and then on my visits to London, it grew upon me that nurse-midwifery was the logical response to the needs of the young child in rural America".

Mary Breckinridge & The Frontier Nursing Service

- Established in 1925
- First Nurse-Midwifery Service in America







It was Cathi Duggar's incredible birth repetience with a Frontier nurse-midwife that gave birth to her own career dream.

During the prenatal care and birth of her last child, Carthi became completely enamoned with the type of care provided by mickwises. Lates during a well-woman visit with her midwife. Karen Neims Curles, a OMP Class 2 graduate, she asked where she

had studied, and Carbi spotted the Frontier diploma on Karen's wall. After struggling with "many excuses why it wouldn't work in our family's life," Carbi finally answered the call to become a nurse-midwife.

"I often told her how her job sounded like one fid enjog" Cathi said, "until one day I had nan out of excuses not to become a nurse-midwile."

In 2005, Cathi, a Class 39 CNEP alumna, graduated from Frontier with her MSN in nurse midwifery. She was drawn to Frontier by the tradition, the holistic model of care,

and the distance education model that worked with her bury family schedule. Since graduating, she has stayed involved, with Frontier, serving as secretary of the Alumni Council.

Today, Cathi and hur family serve as micolonaries to Latin America and the Caribbean, working with Roachylobal, the mission arm of the Evangelical Fee Church of America. Cathi provides care to Nicaraguan refugers in an impoverished barrio near San Jose, Costa Bica, She works with refugers bring at La Cargio, a separaters' community built on a gatasge dump. Cathi also serves the underserved women of Costa Bica and families working as missionaries there. Seeing the widespread need and tack of resources to the underprivileged workheide, Cathis next steps may lead to a PhDL in Public Health with a concernation on materian child preadators.

A DOCTOR PERFORMS SURGERIES FOR FREE

h, Sanday-time to fire up the barbecue, watch the game, sack out in the hammock. Unless you're Dr. Andrew Moore, a plastic surgeon whose heart broke every time a patient told him he couldn't afford to have a melanoma removed

because he had no insurance. "It was so frustrating," Moore says. "How was I going to take care of them?" He started waiving his fees for some, but Moore wanted to do more. In 2005 he launched Surgery on Sunday (surgeryonsunday .org), a nonprofit group of 325 volunteer surgeons, nurses and medical professionals who perform free gall bladder removals, tonsillectomies and other outpatient procedures in a donated surgical facility. To date, Moore's group has performed about 3,000 surgeries-and has a waiting list of 1,500. Raising funds through grants and donations to cover malpractice insurance and medical supplies, this band of medical Samaritans has changed the lives of people like Michael Weyls, a construction worker who lost his job and lived in pain and terror after being diagnosed with a cancerous lesion. A doctor he knew referred him to Moore's group: Moore performed three surgeries and rebuilt Weyls' nose. "It could've killed me, and Dr. Moore worked a miracle," says Weyls, 52, now cancer-free. "I thank God for this man."
